From the moment that we're old enough to understand right from wrong and good from evil, we face the temptation to please our and sin rather than please God. Temptations come in many Some are tempted to tell a lie, some to steal, some to sexual sin, some to take revenge, and some to gossip. When we're afraid or hurting, we may be tempted to get angry and strike back at someone. When we're selfish, greedy, or jealous, we may be tempted to take what is not ours or to put down other people.
Paul spoke of the that he had faced with wanting to do good but giving in to sin. Paul
said, "For what I'm doing, I do not understand; for I'm not practicing what I would like to do, but I'm
doing the very thing I But if I do the very thing I do not want to do, I agree with the Law,
confessing that the Law is good. So now, no longer am I the one doing it, but which dwells in
me" (Romans 7:15-17). That problem faces us all, but the answer to temptation and sin is found in
Christ.
Our reading today comes from 1 Corinthians 9:24-27. In this passage Paul mentions his determined attitude toward doing his best to serve the Lord.
First John 2:15-17 describes the three kinds of appeals that Satan uses to us toward the world and away from God. "Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world—the lust of the, the lust of the, and the of life—is not of the Father but is of the world. And the world is away, and the lust of it; but he who does the of God abides forever." Every temptation known to man comes in one of these three or in a combination of them. The devil is very cunning and uses our desires to us astray from God.
James 1:13-15 reveals to us how temptation to us and what it will do to us. "Let no one
say when he is tempted, 'I am tempted by God'; for God be tempted by evil, nor does He
Himself tempt anyone. But each one is tempted when he's away by his own desires and
enticed. Then, when desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it's full-grown, brings
forth death."

For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you'll be God, knowing good and evil.'"
The devil first tries to get us to God's Word and to make us think that God is trying to withhold some from them. Once Satan gets people to be self-centered rather than believing God, he tells them what they to hear, lies that contradict God.
Jesus told some Jews who wouldn't to Him what the devil is really like. The Lord Jesus said, "You are of your father the devil, and the of your father you want to do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a, he speaks from his own resources (or from his own heart), for he's a liar and the father of it. But because I tell you the truth, you do not believe Me" (John 8:44-45).
The devil wants people to trust in their judgment rather than listen to God. Of course, people who rely solely on their own judgment will to their feelings and desires. When the devil tempted Jesus, he first tried to take advantage of his Matthew 4:1-4 says: "Then Jesus was up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. And when He had forty days and forty nights, afterward He was hungry. Now when the tempter came to Him, he said, 'If You are the Son of God, command that these stones become' But He (Jesus) answered him and said, 'It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every that proceeds from the mouth of God.'"
Jesus was able to the devil because He knew the Father and He also knew the Scriptures. Jesus knew what mattered! God helps us overcome temptation by making us His in Christ. We belong not to ourselves but to Jesus Christ, who died for us on the cross. God also helps us by giving us His Word to us how to live and how to avoid sin. The more we on God's teaching, the more we can temptation and sin.
Solomon advised his son, "Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall your paths. Do not be in your own eyes; fear the LORD and from evil" (Proverbs 3:5-7). The Word of God can give you and help you through the struggles that you face with the devil and with the world. Ananias and Sapphira decided they some of the money that they promised to God. Their for money led them to keep back some of the money, and pretend to give it all, and they lied to God about it. They never expected that their lie to God would cost their lives (read Acts 5:1-10). Judas betrayed Christ for thirty pieces of silver, but it filled him with guilt and regret. Judas went away and hanged himself (Matthew 27:3-5).
We must never assume that sin is no big deal. Apparently, sin was a big enough deal for Jesus to bear the cross, so that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. We can't love the world and love the Lord at the same time. James 4:4 simply says, "Whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God." When you sin, you sin against God; when you resist sin, you tell God that you love Him.
When you're in difficulty, hard temptations, remember to watch and The Lord Jesus warned Peter, James, and John at the Garden of Gethsemane, "Keep watching and praying that you may not enter into temptation; the spirit is, but the flesh is" (Matthew 26:41). Prayer can help you the spiritual strength you need to resist temptation. God is on your side, and He wants to help you.
First Corinthians 10:13 says, "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God is, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of, that you may be able to bear it." One thing we can be sure about. If the temptation is too for us, God will make us a way of escape. When you feel the temptation is too strong for you, start for a way out of the situation.
