No wonder their lives are ______ with doubts and misunderstanding. By pushing the Bible away, they're pushing the Christian life and pushing God away.

The Bible is no ordinary book; it's God's book and God's way of teaching and training us how to ______. It teaches us how to love, how to forgive and how to be forgiven, how to react to suffering, how to grow on the inside, how to discipline ourselves, how to live without hurting other people, and how to make the ______ of our lives. The Bible gives us hope and promise; it gives us joy and peace; it lifts us up; it comforts; it corrects; it trains; and it makes us ______ people. The Word of God is what gives us new life and causes us to be ______ again.

Look what the apostle Peter says in the Bible about the Bible. This is an amazing ______! "Having purified your souls by your obedience to the ______ for a sincere brotherly love, love one another earnestly from a pure heart, since you have been born again, not of perishable ______ but of imperishable, through the living and abiding word of God; for 'All flesh is like grass and all its glory like the flower of grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, but the word of the Lord remains ______.' And this word is the good news that was ______ to you" (1 Peter 1:22-25). God's Word is the ______ to being "born again." No other book can ______ your past and give you the promise and hope of living forever! Every social ______ in this whole world comes from people who ignore the will of God. We need God. We need His hope, His promises, and His laws to live good and peaceful lives. There is simply no other way than the Lord's way.

We can draw close to God by making Him a ______ in our lives every single day. Every day make ______ for God. Spend time in Bible study, not just ______ but study, and prayer. Don't simply read the Word of God, study it and meditate upon it and learn from it and ______ it. Psalm 1:1-3 says, "Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the wicked, nor stands in the way of sinners, nor sits in the seat of scoffers; but his ______ is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. He's like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its ______ in its season, and its leaf doesn't wither. In all that he does, he ______ Kopper in every area of your life.

God also wants you to draw close to Him by opening your _____ to Him in prayer. First Thessalonians 5:17 says, "Pray without ceasing." God is not saying pray 24 hours a day, seven days a week. No one could do that. Instead God is telling us to stop quitting on prayer. Some folks _____ praying altogether. That's what God doesn't want.

If you want to be closer to God, let me suggest a simple ______ every single day. "What is it?" It's this: count your ______. Remember the ______ blessings that God has given to you. Remember God saved you from sin, delivered you from the domain of darkness into the ______ of His beloved Son. Remember the ______, the love that Jesus showed by His suffering for you and me. Remember how God has ______ your prayers. Remember how the Scriptures gave you hope and comfort. Remember the ______ God has given you to deal with the challenges of life. He's been blessing you through the ______. Just look how God has helped you and is helping you now.

Counting your blessings is so ______ for our spirits and attitudes. The Bible teaches us, "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there's any excellence, anything worthy of praise, _____ about these things" (Philippians 4:8). Dwell on them, focus on them. Focusing on the negative will take our _____ off of God. But focusing on what God has done for us will _____ us to stay close to God. When we concentrate on the positive, we _____ more thankful to God. Every day we need to stop and say to God, "thank you, thank you for all You do for us."

There is one more thing about God's blessings that we must remember. God has lovingly prepared a ______ for us, one that gives us hope. The Bible says, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he's caused us to be born again, born again to a living ______ through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in ______ for you, you who by God's power are being guarded through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time" (1 Peter 1:3-5). As Christians we have the true and living

hope in the true and living God. We have all the blessings of God in this life and we have heaven too! In Christ we are of all people most ______.

If there is anything keeping you from being close to God, get ______ of it. Is there anything in your life ______ you of your energy and time, so that you don't have time for God? Some people day after day shut the Lord out of their lives. Hebrews 12:1;2 says: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and ______ which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the ______ that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the ______ that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God."

Many things in our lives can ______ us up. Some things are not sinful in and of themselves, but they so distract and rob us of our time with God, that we lose ______ of the Lord who loves us. We also have to think about sin. Sin, ALL sin, ______ us from God. Isaiah 59:1-2 says, "Behold, the LORD'S hand is not so short that it cannot _____; nor is His ear so dull that it cannot _____. But your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, and your _____ have hidden His face from you so that He does not hear." If you want to draw close to God, you have to ______ the sin out of your lives. I hope you'll do that today.

A middle school in Oregon faced a unique problem. A number of the girls began to use ______. Then they would put it on in the restroom and then press their lips against the mirrors, leaving dozens of little lip ______. This went on several days. Finally the principal decided she had to do something to stop this _______. So, she called the girls to the restroom with the custodian. She explained lip prints caused a major problem for the custodian, who had to _______ the mirrors every day. To demonstrate how difficult it was, she asked the custodian to clean one of the mirrors. He took out a long-handled brush, dipped it in the toilet, and scrubbed the mirror. Since that time there were no more lip prints on the mirrors.
