How we view God matters greatly in how we view life and how we understand our \_\_\_\_\_ and role in this world. An atheist doesn't believe God \_\_\_\_\_ at all. An agnostic says he doesn't know whether God exists, because he \_\_\_\_\_ God is unknowable. Some believe God got the \_\_\_\_\_ going and then just abandoned it. Several years ago in graduate school, I spent a couple of semesters studying skeptics and atheists. ## Our scripture reading today comes from the book of Proverbs 3:5-8.

Paul said in Ephesians 1:18-19, "I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened, so that you may \_\_\_\_\_ what is the hope of His calling, what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints, and what is the surpassing greatness of His power toward us who believe." Have you ever had an "aha!" experience—awakening to some great \_\_\_\_\_ that had eluded you up until that time? That's what Paul wanted for the Ephesians. | understanding. Paul proclaimed: "And in the generations gone by He permitted all the nations   |
| to go their ways; and yet He did not leave Himself without witness, in that He did             |
| good and gave you rains from heaven and fruitful seasons, satisfying your hearts with food and |
| gladness" (Acts 14:16-17). All that we have, all of our blessings from God!                    |
