Living without God's teaching in your life is like sewing with a needle that has no ______ or like writing your biography with a pen empty of ______. Some years ago psychologist William Marston asked 3000 people, "What do you have to live for?" He found that 94% were simply enduring the present while waiting for the ______. They were waiting for something to happen someday. They wanted to finish school, or watch their children grow up, or take a long vacation, or retire. They were ______, not realizing that all anyone ever has is today, because yesterday is gone and tomorrow is only a hope.

Solomon said, "Then I considered all that my hands had done and the toil I had expended in doing it, and behold, all was ______ and a striving after wind, and there was nothing to be gained under the sun" (Ecclesiastes 2:11). You might look at your life and wonder what ______ you've made in this world. Is your life merely a striving after wind?

C. T. Studd, nearly a hundred years ago, wrote two lines that make one pause and consider what ______ in life. He wrote "Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last." Because there's ______ to life than the here and now, we must consider our eternal destiny and what matters when this life is over.

Our reading today comes from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians 5:15-21.

God gives us life one day at a time, and it's ______. Jacob, when he was 130 years old, told Pharaoh, "few and unpleasant have been the years of my life" (Genesis 47:9). One hundred and thirty years still seems long to me, but Jacob called them "_____." David said, "LORD, make me to know my ______ And what is the extent of my days; Let me know how transient I am. Behold, You have made my days as handbreadths, And my lifetime as nothing in Your sight; Surely every man at his best is a mere ______" (Psalm 39:4-5).

How we live matters, and whether we remember God through our lives is crucial to how we spend ______. The Preacher, Solomon, wrote, "Rejoice, young man, during your childhood, and let your heart be pleasant during the days of young manhood. And follow the impulses of your heart and the desires of your eyes. Yet know that God will bring you to ______ for all these things" (Ecclesiastes 11:9).

We must take notice of God's Word where he says, "Therefore be ______ how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise, making the most of your time, because the days are evil. So then do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is" (Ephesians 5:15-17). I'd like to suggest some things that we must take time to do:

Listening encourages and solves ______; it brings comfort and it brings healing. Your life will be richer by far the more you ______ to listen. Proverbs 11:14 says, "Where there is no guidance, the people fall, But in abundance of counselors there is ______." Proverbs 15:22 says, "Without consultation, plans are frustrated, But with many counselors they ______." Getting godly and wise advice can make the difference between success and failure. "Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last."

Second, take time to ______. I don't know everything that I want to know, for sure; but I suspect you feel that way too at times. Psalm 119:105 says, "Thy word is a ______ to my feet, And a ______ to my path." I want to know what God says. Psalm 119:98-99 says, "Thy commandments make me ______ than my enemies, For they are ever mine. I have more insight than all my teachers, For Thy testimonies are my meditation." God gives us ______ wisdom that guides us now and leads us to eternal life.
