Our reading today comes from The Gospel According to John 1:1-5.
This time of year many people focus on the birth of Christ, but did you know that Jesus has
existed? In fact, there's never been a time when Jesus did not exist. Jesus was no mere

John 1:14 says, "And the Word became flesh and among us, and we have seen his
glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." People are made up of both
flesh and spirit, and the eternal spirit of the Lord Jesus took on flesh and to us the glory of
God in heaven. Jesus Christ, by becoming flesh, gave us two immeasurably valuable
essential to our lives: grace and truth. We have the grace that us and the truth that sets us
! Oh, be grateful for the Word that became flesh.
In John 1:15-18, John the Baptist testified about Jesus, "This was He of whom I said, 'He who
comes after me has a higher rank than I, for He before me.' For of His fullness we have all
received, and grace upon grace. For the Law was given through Moses; and were
realized through Jesus Christ. No one has seen God at any time; the only begotten God who is in the

bosom of the Father, He has Him." We know what God is like because we know Jesus.
The Lord Jesus said, "He who has seen Me has seen the Father" (John 14:9).
The Hebrew writer also helps us to understand how the Father in heaven Himself
through the Lord Jesus. Hebrews 1:1-3 says, "God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the
prophets in many portions and in many ways, in these last days has to us in His Son, whom
He appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the world. And He is the radiance of His
glory and the representation of His nature, and upholds all things by the word of His power.
When He had made purification of sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high."

things by the word of His power, gives us an exact representation of the of God. The better

Jesus is the of all things. John 3:35 says, "The Father loves the Son and has given
things into His hand." The Lord Jesus said, "All has been given to Me" (Matthew 28:18).
The Lord Jesus is now at the right hand of the Majesty on high. He upholds your existence
and mine. He c everything that exists. Colossians 1:15-17 says, "He is the of
the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by Him all things were, both in the
heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all
things have been created through Him and for Him. He is before all things, and in Him all things hold
together."
Sometimes people hear the words "firstborn of all creation" and that Jesus was the first
created being. However, if all things were created by Him and for Him, He be a created
being. The word "firstborn," here is misunderstood. The title "firstborn" here is speaking not of
chronology but of preeminence. It's not that Jesus is the first created person, but that He has a place of
authority all creation. He has a superior status over creation and his existence is to
creation. He was in the beginning and has always existed, and now God has given Him authority over
all creation. Jesus prayed to His Father, "Now, Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, and the glory
which I had with You before the world was" (John 17:5). Jesus was not created; He always existed.
Jesus existed the world began, why then would He become a man? Why would a Divine
Jesus become flesh? There are some very good reasons.
First, Jesus became a man to us from our sins. An angel of the Lord told Joseph, "Joseph,
son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife; for the Child who has been conceived in her
is of the Holy Spirit. She will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His
people from their sins" (Matthew 1:20-21). John the Baptist described Jesus as the "Lamb of God who
takes away the of the world" (John 1:29). Jesus had to take on flesh in order to be a

Hebrews 10:4-7 says, "For it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins.
Therefore, when He [that is, Jesus] comes into the world, He says, 'Sacrifice and offering You have not
desired, but a You have prepared for Me; in whole burnt offerings and sacrifices for sin You
have taken no pleasure. And then I said, "behold, I have come (in the scroll of the book it is written of
Me) to do your, O God." Jesus had to take on flesh, so that He could give His body as a

sacrifice for our sins. Jesus was born to First Peter 2:24 says, "and He Himself bore our sins in
His body on the cross, so that we might to sin and to righteousness; for by His
wounds you were healed."
Second, Jesus took on flesh so that we might humility and obedience. The Bible says
"Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, although He existed in the form
of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but Himself, taking the
form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. Being found in appearance as a man,
He humbled Himself by becoming to the point of death, even death on a cross"
(Philippians 2:5-8). Jesus became human in order to die on the cross. Though Jesus existed in the form
of God, He had to empty Himself, to make Himself nothing.
He left Heaven's out of love to bless humanity. "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus
Christ, that though He was, yet for your sake He became, so that you through His
poverty might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). Jesus thought nothing of Himself so that He could
bless you and me with life. I can't imagine all the glory and majesty of heaven, but Jesus
left it all to be born in a stable. He endured all the hardships of mankind. He never knew the joy of a
family, never owned a house, never had a hot shower, and did not grow old. He became poor so you
and I might have an imperishable, undefiled home in heaven.
Third, Jesus came into the world to bring us the Jesus told Pontius Pilate, "For this I
have been born, and for this I have come into the world, to to the truth. And everyone who
is of the truth hears My voice" (John 18:37). Jesus embodies truth. He said, "I am the Way, the Truth,
and the Life; and no one to the Father but by Me" (John 14:6). If you wish to know the
truth, listen to Jesus. If you wish to know right from wrong, listen to Jesus. God once spoke from
heaven to Peter, James and John about Jesus. God said, "This is My beloved Son, with whom I am
well-pleased; to Him!" (Matthew 17:5). So we must pay close attention to everything the
Lord Jesus says.
Carefully listening to Jesus brings a The Lord Jesus said, "I've come as Light into the
world, so that everyone who believes in Me will not remain in darkness" (John 12:46). The Roman
Empire in the days of Jesus was with confused pagans, who felt enslaved by morally
corrupt gods that they invented. The Roman gods didn't understand love. Pagans were cruel and
oppressive, and had little appreciation for human life or freedom.
The Bible teaches the Gentile world, "So this I say, and affirm together with the Lord, that you walk
no longer just as the Gentiles also walk, in the futility of their mind, being in their
understanding, excluded from the life of God because of the ignorance that's in them, because of the
hardness of their heart; and they, having become callous, have given themselves over to sensuality for
the practice of every kind of impurity with greediness" (Ephesians 4:17-19). The Lord Jesus
morality and lived righteously. He demonstrated by his life and his death on the cross what
love and forgiveness truly are. Jesus is the Light in a dark world, true healing in a suffering society, and
real for a confused culture. God knew what we needed. What a blessing Jesus is to us!
The Lord Jesus said, "The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I came that they may have
, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10). He gives us His grace, forgiving us of our

What does that mean for you? Jesus was born so He could die for you. Jesus became flesh knowing from the beginning that He would be crucified. He willingly emptied and humbled Himself in order to bear a cross for you. Don't think of this as trivial, because it wasn't trivial to the Father or to Jesus Christ. No one has ever done more to bless your life than Jesus did on the cross. No one but Jesus could give you forgiveness or eternal life. Do you take the Lord seriously?

If you do, what have you done about it? Have you committed yourself to follow Jesus and His teaching? Have you placed your trust in Him and confessed Him as the Christ, the Son of God? Have you turned away from sin? Have you been baptized into Christ? According to Romans 6:3, being baptized into Christ means being baptized into His death. Jesus shed His blood in His death, so baptism into Christ puts us in contact with His blood that forgives us. Baptism is also the time when the Lord adds us to His church. We need to come to Christ, we need to be baptized, and to get involved in the church. I pray that our time together will encourage you to act.
