For when they maintain this, it escapes their notice that by the word of God the heavens existed long ago and the earth was formed out of water and by water, through which the world at that time was destroyed, being flooded with water. But by His word the present heavens and earth are being reserved for, kept for the day of judgment and destruction of ungodly men. But do not let this one escape your notice, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years like one day. The Lord is not slow about His promise, as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing for any to but for all to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, in which the heavens will pass away with a roar and the elements will be destroyed with intense heat, and the earth and its works will be burned up" (2 Peter 3:3-10). the idea that Jesus arose from the dead. But when the stone was rolled back and the grave clothes were lying by themselves, people marveled!
Whatever Jesus predicted always proved He predicted the destruction of Jerusalem in Matthew 24; and in 70 AD Titus and the Roman army destroyed Jerusalem, fulfilling the prophecy to the last Jesus also predicted the end in Matthew 24:35-36, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but My will not pass away. But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father alone." Jesus said He did not know when He would return—in fact, no one knows but the Some people they know, but Jesus said no one knows!
That's what Peter and Paul mean when they say that the day of the Lord will come like a in the night (2 Peter 3:10; 1 Thessalonians 5:2). If Jesus, Peter and Paul said no one knows when it will happen we those who think they do know. In every generation since the first century some have imagined they had out the day and the hour when Jesus would return. I remember years ago getting a book through the mail, "88 Reasons Why Jesus Is Coming in 1988." Those 88 reasons proved to be speculation!
I have another book in my library by a self-proclaimed prophet who said the end of the kingdoms of the world will take place in 1914. He had an elaborate scheme, but his prediction proved Jesus didn't return in 1914. No one knows when Jesus will come again; but we do know that when he comes everyone will about it. The apostle John said in 96 AD, "Behold, He is coming with the clouds, and every will see Him, even those who pierced Him; and all the tribes of the earth will mourn over Him. So it is to be. Amen" (Revelation 1:7). When Jesus comes again, you'll know it! This passage in Revelation was written more than 60 years after the crucifixion of Jesus, but the soldiers who pierced him would see Him coming in the clouds. Likely those soldiers were already dead. John said even those who are in the will rise from the dead to see Jesus at His return! Not only will people see Jesus when He comes again, they'll hear about it. Paul, "the Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. Then we who are alive and remain will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air, and so we shall always be with the Lord" (1 Thessalonians 4:16-17).
When He comes, the dead in Christ will rise first; but they won't be the ones to rise on that day. The Lord Jesus said, "Do not marvel at this; for an hour is coming, in which who are in the tombs will hear His voice, and will come forth; those who did the good deeds to a resurrection of life, and those who committed evil deeds to a resurrection of judgment" (John 5:28-29). When Jesus comes again from all time and all places will rise again!
Jesus said this resurrection of both the good and bad will happen in the same hour, when all will His voice. Once the resurrection takes place then we'll rise to meet the Lord in the air (as Paul said in 1 Thessalonians 4:17), and the faithful will be with Him always. Once men leave this earth "the present heavens and earth are being reserved for " (2 Peter 3:7). Those who set their on this life or this world need to know that this is not where they're going to spend eternity. The day that Jesus comes again we'll be taken from this earth to before the throne of Christ. We'll stand before His throne to be on that day.
Paul said, "For we must all before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each one may be recompensed for his deeds in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad" (2

Corinthians 5:10). The Lord Jesus will judge each of us according to our: how we lived, how we talked, how we treated other people, and how we were thinking.
