The Resurrection 1 Corinthians 15:12-19

Job asked, "If a man dies, will he again?" You may be asking that question, too.
Today, we're going to explore the great that we have in Christ. The Word of God is
the only book that can give us the true to the most pressing questions of life:
Where did we come from? Why are we here? What will happen to us after we die? The
Scriptures tell us that God us after His own image so that we might seek and serve

Job asked an important question, "If a man dies, will he live again?" From our
senses, we can't answer that question. We don't have any record of someone
who's died and has been buried coming back to life, so it's only natural for us to ask if there is
life after death.
We do, however, have a record of the resurrection of the The
apostles and many others were certainly eyewitnesses of the resurrection. They believed so
in the resurrection of Jesus Christ that they were willing to give their lives and
suffer in order to tell the story throughout the world. The resurrection of Jesus
demonstrates God's to raise the dead.
The Scriptures reveal God's eternal to raise us up on the last day and take us
home to heaven. That's a message! One that fills us with hope. The Lord Jesus said, "This is
the will of Him who sent Me, that of all that He has given Me I lose nothing, but raise it up on
the last day. For this is the will of My Father, that everyone who beholds the Son and believes
in Him will have eternal life, and I Myself will raise him up on the last day" (John 6:39-40).
Our reading today comes from The First Letter of Paul to the Corinthians 15:12-19.
When you ask people about what happens after death you'll get answers.
Some think death is the, and a person just ceases to exist. Some say the righteous will
live on while the unrighteous will to exist. Others think that we'll be reincarnated in
different forms on earth. Hebrews 9:27, however, teaches that we suffer death
, and after this comes judgment. Even in the New Testament, the Sadducees and the
Pharisees disagreed over whether there would be a resurrection. The Bible isn't simply one
voice among many; it speaks God's with authority. The Lord Jesus discussed the
resurrection with the Sadducees. Let's begin our study of the resurrection with that discussion.
Read what the Bible says in Matthew 22:23-32. This passage says thatdoes go
on after death. The body dies but the spirit of a man continues to in conscious form.
The Bible presents the resurrection as event, not two. Both the righteous and the

wicked will arise on day. Read what the Lord Jesus said in John 5:25-29 .
At the end time when Jesus comes again, He will call who are in the tombs to come

in answer to the call of Jesus Christ. He'll then all men. The Scriptures teach us that
there is but one resurrection of all people. Paul said at Mars Hill, "there shall
certainly be a resurrection of the righteous and the wicked" (Acts 24:15).
For those who God and Him faithfully, belief in the resurrection is a great
promise and comfort. As a minister, I've spent many hours at funeral homes and cemeteries.
I've watched families as they lowered the casket of a dearly loved one into the
ground or placed it in a mausoleum. Nothing could bring back that loved one, but knowing
that there is a resurrection helped to them. We can be confident of the resurrection,
because we know that the Lord never lies. We can trust every from His mouth.
In John chapter 11, Jesus went to Bethany to with the sisters of Lazarus, Mary
and Martha. They were grieving over the of Lazarus. The Lord Jesus told Martha,
"Your brother will rise again.' Martha said to Him, 'I know that he will rise again in the
resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life; he who
believes in Me will live even if he dies, and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never
die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:23-26).
The Lord Jesus with the two sisters, Mary and Martha, and then He called
Lazarus back to life. In spite of the fact that he had been in the tomb for days and there
would be a stench, Lazarus did miraculously come back to life. They moved that heavy stone,
and they took the linen wrappings off of him, and they gave him back to his sisters
Everyone who was there saw the and they believed it. Even the Jewish enemies of
Jesus believed in His to raise the dead. The enemies of Jesus said, "What are we
doing? For this man is performing many signs (that is, miracles). If we let Him go on like this,
all men will in Him" (John 11:47-48). If He could raise Lazarus from the dead, my
friend, He can raise you.
The Bible reveals that in the resurrection our bodies will We die with flesh and
blood, but we won't live throughout in a body like we have now. Our bodies will
be changed from this body to a body that is glorified and immortal.
The Bible says, "Now I say this, brethren, that flesh and blood cannot the kingdom
of God (that is, heaven); nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable. Behold, I tell you a
mystery; we will not all sleep, but we will all be, in a moment, in the twinkling of
an eye, at the last trumpet; for the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable,
and we will be changed. For this perishable must put on the imperishable, and this mortal must
put on immortality. But when this perishable will have put on the imperishable, and this mortal
will have put on immortality, then will come about the saying that is written, 'Death is

swallowed up in O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?'
The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law; but thanks be to God, who gives us
the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Corinthians 15:50-57).
The fleshly body is subject to death, but the body that is changed, the one we'll have in the
resurrection, will be first of all imperishable and second it will be immortal. It cannot
First Corinthians 15:42-44 says, "So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown a perishable
body, it is raised an imperishable body; it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in; it is sown
in weakness, it is raised in; it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. If
there is a natural body, there is also a spiritual body." The body that we put into the ground will
not be the body that we'll have once God has raised us up and changed us. This body

First Corinthians 15:47-49 says, "The first man (Adam) is from the, earthy; the
second man is from As is the earthy, so also are those who are earthy; and as is
the heavenly, so also are those who are heavenly. Just as we have borne the of the
earthy, we will also bear the of the heavenly." In the resurrection, our bodies will
be glorified like the body of the Lord Jesus. We won't suffer there from a deteriorating body.
I love God's promise, "Beloved, now we are children of God, and it has not appeared as
yet what we be. We know that when He appears, we will be Him, because
we will see Him just as He is" (1 John 3:2). Our bodies will be spiritual and immortal. We'll
the greatness and grandeur of our God because we'll be changed. This will enable us to
see and hear things in the spiritual and heavenly realm that we'll be able to see and
hear in this life with a fleshly body.
Let's not get so caught up in this life that we that we have our permanent
home, as Christians, in heaven. In baptism, we with Christ and are raised up with Him

that we might with Him forever. The Bible says, "Therefore if you have been raised
up with Christ, (that is, you've been baptized and given this new life) keep the
things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your on the things

Christ in God. When Christ, who is our life, is revealed, then you also will be revealed with
Him in" (Colossians 3:1-4).
When we're baptized into Christ, God us with Him in His burial and His
resurrection. Through baptism, God makes us His children and gives us newness of life. When
God unites us with Christ in baptism, our names are in the book of life. This
