or take a long vacation, or retire. They were, not realizing that all anyone ever has
is today, because yesterday is gone and tomorrow is only a hope.
Solomon said, "Then I considered all that my hands had done and the toil I had expended in
doing it, and behold, all was and a striving after wind, and there was nothing to be
gained under the sun" (Ecclesiastes 2:11). You might look at your life and wonder what
you've made in this world. Is your life merely a striving after wind?
C. T. Studd, nearly a hundred years ago, wrote two lines that make one pause and consider
what in life. He wrote "Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for
Christ will last." Because there's to life than the here and now, we must consider our
eternal destiny and what matters when this life is over.

He is your Creator; He sustains your life; and His Son is your only Savior. Without Him, you

no on Jesus. Matthew 27:22-23 reveals that they all said, "'Let Him be!'
And Pilate said, 'Why, what evil has He?' But they shouted all the more, 'Let Him be
