Our reading today comes from Mark 9:2-8.

When we become Christians, we Jesus Christ is the Son of God. The New Testamen
clearly applies this, Son of God, to Jesus. That He is the Son of God is
throughout the New Testament. The angel Gabriel told Mary of Nazareth, "Do not be afraid, Mary; fo
you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you
shall name Him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord Goo
will give Him the throne of His father David" (Luke 1:30-32). A little bit later Mary said to the angel
"How can this be, since I am a virgin?' The angel answered and said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come
upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; and for that reason the holy Child
shall be called the Son of God'" (Luke 1:34-35).
When Jesus came to John the Baptist to be, the Father Himself recognized Jesus as
His Son. Matthew 3:17 says, "After being baptized, Jesus came up immediately from the water; and
behold, the heavens were opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending as a dove and lighting or

Him, and behold, a out of the heavens said, 'This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well-pleased."
As God's Son, Jesus cast out demons, and the demons who Jesus really was. For instance, Mark 3:10,11 says, "for He had healed many, with the result that all those who had afflictions pressed around Him in order to touch Him. Whenever the unclean spirits saw Him, they would fall down before Him and shout, 'You are the Son of God!'"
When Jesus led Peter, James, and John up on a mountain, as we read a moment ago, He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His garments became as as light. Moses and Elijah appeared to them and with Jesus. When Peter suggested building three tabernacles, one for Jesus, one for Moses, and one for Elijah, Matthew 17:5 says, "While he was still speaking, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and behold, a voice out of the cloud said, 'This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to Him!"
The apostle remembered that occasion and commented on it. "For we did not follow cleverly devised tales when we made known to you the and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of His majesty. For when He received honor and glory from God the Father, such an utterance as this was made to Him by the Majestic Glory, 'This is My beloved Son with whom I am well-pleased'— and we ourselves heard this utterance made from when we were with Him on the holy mountain" (2 Peter 1:16-18). Here is the second time God, from heaven, acknowledged Jesus as His Son.
As Christians, we must to the Lord Jesus as God's Son. Hebrews 1:1-5 says, "Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the, but in these last days he has to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. He is the radiance of the glory of God and the exact imprint of his, and he upholds the universe by the word of his power. After making purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the he has inherited is more excellent than theirs. For to which of the angels did God ever say, 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you'? Or again, 'I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son'?
Claiming to be God's Son had a to pay for Jesus. John 5:8 says, "For this reason therefore the Jews were seeking all the more to Him, because He not only was breaking the Sabbath, but also was calling God His own Father, making Himself with God." Jesus knew this and claimed to be the Son of God, and this stresses His deity.
In John 10:30-33 the Lord Jesus said, "I and the Father are' The Jews picked up stones again to stone Him. Jesus answered them, 'I showed you many good from the Father; for which of them are you stoning Me?' The Jews answered Him, 'For a good work we do not stone You, but for blasphemy; and because You, being a man, make Yourself out to be" This is not the only place in the gospel of John where Jesus is called "God." John 1:1 says, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." When Jesus appeared to Thomas, who had doubted His resurrection, Jesus offered to show him His hands and His side, Thomas said, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28).

At His trial before the Jewish Council they asked Jesus about this: "And they all said, 'Are You the Son of God, then?' And He said to them, 'Yes, I am.' Then they said, 'What further need do we have of testimony? For we have heard it ourselves from His own " (Luke 22:70-71). They condemned Jesus to for blasphemy when He admitted to being the Son of God.
Perhaps, here we should remember the marvelous of God our Father. John 3:16-17 reminds us, "For God so the world, that he gave his only (only begotten) Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be through him." The gift of Jesus was not a petty gift; it had a most important God wanted so much to save you and me from that He willingly sacrificed His Son Jesus. Jesus did not come to earth to condemn us but to us. God loved you, no matter who you are, enough to sacrifice His precious Son, who the punishment for your sins and mine.
Isaiah 53:5-6 says, "But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us, and with his wounds we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all." I can only imagine the sorrow, pain, and anguish the Lord Jesus endured bearing the iniquity of us all.
Jesus also fulfilled God's prophecy as the Son of God in His In Psalm 2:7, we have the prophecy: "I will surely tell of the decree of the LORD: He said to Me, 'You are My Son, Today I have begotten You." When Paul was on his first missionary journey he referred to this passage and showed that it referred to the Lord Jesus. He said, "And we preach to you the good news of the made to the fathers, that God has fulfilled this promise to our children in that He up Jesus, as it is also written in the second Psalm, 'You are my son; today I have begotten you'" (Acts 13:32-33). The resurrection was indeed a moment for the Lord Jesus. While from His birth He was the Son of God, God made this undeniable at His resurrection. Romans 1:4 says Jesus "was declared the Son of God with by the resurrection from the dead."
We can see the character and power of God when we on Jesus. The Jews thought it was for Jesus to call Himself the Son of God. In John 5:19 Jesus answered their charge and explained, "Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do of Himself, unless it is something He sees the Father doing; for whatever the Father does, these things the Son also does in like manner." We can know the Father in heaven by knowing the Son, Jesus.
How we treat Jesus Christ shows how we treat the Father in heaven. Disbelief in Jesus as the Son of God is the as disbelief in God the Father Himself. The Lord Jesus said, "For not even the Father judges anyone, but He has given all judgment to the Son, so that all will honor the Son even as they honor the Father. He who does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent Him" (John 5:22-23). We must listen to the Son because the Son, Jesus, will us on the last day.
The Lord Jesus said, "He who rejects Me and does not receive My sayings, has one who judges him; the I spoke is what will judge him at the last day. For I did not speak on My own initiative, but the Father Himself who sent Me has Me a commandment as to what to say and what to speak. the Father has told Me" (John 12:48-50). We must learn to the Son if we wish to live eternally with the Father. The words of the Son are actually the words of the Father. He now speaks through His Son not through false prophets. We must learn to in His words in all that they teach. Second John 9 speaks of a particular false teaching. "Everyone who goes on ahead and does not abide in the of Christ, does not have God. Whoever abides in the teaching has the Father and the Son." I do not know of any teaching of Jesus that one can change or willfully disobey and still God. To stop listening to Jesus causes one to lose his relationship with God the Father.
One day, as the Son of God, Jesus will everyone from the dead. Though your body may be in the, the Lord will raise you up. He said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, an hour is coming and now is, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live. For just as the Father has life in Himself, even so He gave to the Son also to have life in Himself; and He gave Him to execute judgment, because He is the Son of Man. Do not marvel at this; for an hour is coming, in which who are in the tombs will hear His voice, and will come forth; those who did the good deeds to a resurrection of life, those who committed the evil deeds to a resurrection of judgment" (John 5:25-29). By your life and your attitudes, you're determining what of resurrection you will face.
Jesus makes this to the faithful and obedient when He returns. "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms (or mansions). If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also" (John 14:1-3). I want to live with the Lord forever, and I pray that you do too. Jesus is in deed, God's Son, listen to Him.
"Although He was a Son, He learned from the things which He suffered. And having been made perfect, He became to all those who Him the source of eternal salvation" (Hebrews 5:8-9). Jesus, as God's Son, obeyed His Father. Because He obeyed and was made perfect He could become the of our eternal salvation to those who obey Him. Not everyone is to believe in Christ or obey Him. John 1:11-13 says, "He came to His own, and those who were His own did not Him. But as many as received Him, to them He gave the to become children of God, even to those who believe in His name, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God." You and I can, by faith and obedience, be again and can become children of God!
John 3:36 makes it clear: "He who believes in the Son has life; but he who does not the Son will not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him." To say we believe but then be unwilling to repent or be unwilling to obey or unwilling to be baptized for the forgiveness of our sins is an empty, dead faith. Peter told the people at Pentecost in Acts 2:38 to repent and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of their sins. That stands true for us today. We become the children of God when we believe and are baptized. Galatians 3:26-27 says, "For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." You can become a child of God today because of the Son of God.

come from words that mean "to anoint with sacred oil"; these titles refer to "the anointed one."
In the Old Testament three groups received an anointing to establish their as God

him at his right hand in the heavenly places, far above all rule and authority and power and dominion,
and above every name that is named, not only in this age but also in the one to come. And he put all
things under his feet and gave him as over all things to the church, which is his body, the
fullness of him who fills all in all." From the moment He arose from the dead Jesus has been
over all.
Jesus Christ not only has all authority in heaven and on earth, He is also the "head" of the church.
He is the "head" of the church in this or in any generation. Some ignore this; they have an

Jesus the Savior

If Jesus is the Savior, then someone saving. Today we're going to explore what it
means to Jesus our Savior. More than through any other means we come to our
Father in heaven and the Lord Jesus Christ through the inspired Scriptures. In fact, if it were not for
the Scriptures, we would never know the most important of life. We wouldn't know where
we came from, why we exist, or what will happen to us when this life is over. God's message from
the beginning to end is a message of life, of hope, and of love.
Jesus came to this to be a Savior. The angel told Joseph before Jesus was born , "She
will bear a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus, for He will His people from their sins"
(Matthew 1:21). When John the Baptist introduced Jesus to his disciples, he said, "Behold, the Lamb
of God who takes away the of the world!" (John 1:29). Jesus "bore our sins in His body on
the cross, so that we might to sin and to righteousness; for by His wounds you were
healed" (1 Peter 2:24). Saving us isn't simply ridding us of the sin; it's also transforming our hearts
and lives tofor righteousness. John 3:16-17 says, "For God so loved the world, that He
His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life.
For God did not send the Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be
through Him." Jesus is indeed in the saving business. Jesus is our Savior from sin
implying that we needed saving and that sin is a problem.
Our reading today is 1 Timothy 1:12-16.
We all have a problem, and the Scriptures are clear, that problem is sin. The sin
problem is universal. You have it, I have it, and every responsible person has it. Psalm 14:2-3 says,
"The LORD has looked down from heaven upon the sons of men To see if there are any who
understand, Who seek after God. They have turned aside, together they have become corrupt;
There is no one who does, not even one." Isaiah understood the problem when he wrote,
"All of us like sheep have gone astray, Each of us has turned to his own" (Isaiah 53:6).
Again, Romans 3:23 simply says, "for all have sinned and fall short of the of God."

the Lord out to be a liar for saying that we really do sin. When people deny they have sinned, they're
also denying what God in Scripture.
The apostle Paul, looking back at his life, said, "For we know that the Law is spiritual, but I am of
flesh, sold into bondage to sin. For what I am doing, I do not understand; for I am not practicing what
I would like to do, but I am doing the very thing I "(Romans 7:14-15). He continues in verses
19 to 24, "For the that I want, I do not do, but I practice the very that I do not
want. But if I am doing the very thing I do not want, I am no longer the one doing it, but
which dwells in me. I find then the principle that is present in me, the one who wants to do
good. For I joyfully concur with the law of God in the inner man, but I see a different law in the
members of my body, waging against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the
law of sin which is in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will set me from the
body of this death?"
Think a little about Paul's despair, "Wretched man that I am!" Have you ever that way
about yourself when you considered your sins? Most of us might admit that we've sinned, but we
don't realize the sins we commit have affected us. People do unspeakable things they never
thought or wanted to do, and this makes them feel guilty about doing it and ashamed of themselves
for being the kind of person who would do it. Some feel there's no hope and no way out of this
despair, because of the pleasures of sin and how they enslave us. Paul asked, "Who will set me
from the body of this death?" He knew that if he continued his sinful ways, he would face
eternal separation from the God that he loved.
Thankfully, Paul answers the question. He said in verse 25, "Thanks be to God Jesus
Christ our Lord! So then, on the one hand I myself with my mind am serving the law of God, but on
the other, with my flesh the law of sin." This struggle goes on in the heart and mind of
person; but Jesus is the answer! He can deliver us from the death caused by sin. Romans
8:1-2 explains, "Therefore there is now no condemnation for those who are Christ Jesus. For
the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you from the law of sin and of death."
Our salvation is a deliverance, a from sin and from an evil way of life. God wanted
something for us, and the blood of Jesus sacrificed on the cross provides the way of
freedom from sin and the way to a better and more abundant life. Galatians 1:4 says that Jesus Christ
"gave Himself for our sins so that He might (save) us from this present evil age,

according to the will of our God and Father." The first century was an evil, pagan age. Centuries
have passed; but we live in an evil age, filled with deception and temptation.
God wants to make a difference! Colossians 1:13-14 says, "For He rescued us from the domain
(that is, the power) of darkness, and transferred us to the of His beloved Son, in
whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins." We don't have to be under the devil's
and be condemned with him. Jesus can rescue us from the consequences of our sins
and give us hope and eternal life.
Jesus rescues sinners because He us and doesn't want us to be lost eternally. Jesus
rescues sinners not only by sacrificing Himself for our sins but also through giving us hope through
His, in the Word of God. Salvation becomes precious, because the consequences of sin
are so great. Knowing the of the Lord, we persuade people (2 Corinthians 5:11). Talking
about these matters is essential! It's cruel to suggest sin doesn't We talk about sin, but
we speak of the of the gospel message. We in love. We preach by
speaking of the love and the grace of God who offers forgiveness and eternal life with the Father in
heaven.
Have you considered people in Scripture that Jesus rescued? I think of the prodigal son who
selfishly lived for his own until he came to his senses. I think of the woman at the well,
who had five previous husbands and was at the time living with a man. I think of the chief tax
collector Zacchaeus, who may have been the most man in Jericho for collecting taxes
for Rome and for possibly defrauding the taxpayers. Jesus still loved all these people and wanted
them to Him. He was not like the Pharisees who grumbled at Him for
with sinners.
Have you considered the of sinners, Saul of Tarsus, who became the apostle Paul?
Read what Paul said in 1 Timothy 1:15-16. If Christ could save the chief of sinners, He can save
you too. If He can find mercy, so can you. If Christ could have perfect patience with the foremost
sinner, He can have perfect patience with you!
Salvation is not merely given to forgive; God wants to our lives. He wants
something better for us than to sin. He doesn't want us so enslaved to evil. He wants us
to for righteousness and to become a blessing. Paul describes this salvation and change
ReadTitus 3:3-7.
The world Christ has all those characteristics. You can see foolishness, and
disobedience, and deception, enslavement to lusts and pleasures. You can see people spending their
lives in malice and envy. You can see the hatefulness present in so many lives. What we need is an
answer to these selfish ways. People speak of worldly religions as an answer, but false religions
won't the inner man from living for sin to living for righteousness. They may have strict
rules, but they forget the of the heart in changing life. The Lord Jesus touches our hearts
and helps us evil by washing us clean, causing us to be born again, and living new lives.
The Lord justifies us by and makes us heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

a Savior. You may have against God and wandered away from the church, you need
to repent and come back to God; and yes, you need your sins forgiven by the Savior. Sin may not be
a big deal to you, but you're not the One by sin. God doesn't see sin as trivial. He
wouldn't have given up His Son Jesus to be crucified as a sacrifice for your sin, if sin were insignificant.

Yes, no matter who you are, you need a Savior, and the only one who can save you from sin and give you eternal life is our Lord Jesus Christ. We're all in the same condition. We cannot save ourselves by ourselves. We can't earn salvation or eternal life. **Read Ephesians 2:8-9.** God is not indebted to us; we are accountable to Him.

So how do we respond to this gift of grace from God? We place our trust in Him by believing in Jesus Christ and His promises. If we take God seriously, we can't continue in sin. We must repent of our evil and start living according to His will. With faith and repentance, we confess our faith in Jesus Christ and are baptized into His death. Jesus the Lord

We call Him Jesus Christ, but the Scriptures many times call Him the Jesus Christ. Today,
we're exploring what it to call Jesus "Lord." We search the Scriptures for many reasons; but
we primarily search because we the Lord. We want to Him and all He has done for us.
Because we love Him we want to know how to Him. We search what the Lord says because as
Christians we belong to Him and want to in His way. We know the Lord's way is the
way and the right way to live. We thank God that He's left His Scriptures so that we might know these
things and enjoy life in heaven with Him.
When we speak of Jesus we of Him as the Christ. The word "Christ" means, "Anointed";
it's the Greek equivalent of the Hebrew word "Messiah." For centuries, the Jews longed for and looked
for the Messiah to The prophets spoke of the Messiah, the Son of David, the new king of Israel;
but they didn't understand the kingdom was, and His kingdom would include people from all
nations. To say Jesus is the Christ is to say He is truly the King of kings and the Lord of lords. We also
confess Jesus as the Son of God. At His baptism the Heavenly Father said of Jesus, "This is My beloved
Son, in whom I am well-pleased" (Matthew 3:17). Later, the Father acknowledging Jesus as His Son said,
" to Him!" (Matthew 17:5). The New Testament also of our confessing "Jesus is
Lord" in Romans 10:9. For some this confession sounds different; but the phrase "Lord Jesus" or "Lord
Jesus Christ" appears more than a hundred times in the New Testament. What does it mean to call Jesus,
"Lord"?
Our reading today comes from the book of Philippians 2:5-11.
God promised, "For a child will be born to us, a son will be given to us; And the government will
rest upon His shoulders; And His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father,
Prince of Peace. There will be no to the increase of His government or of peace, On the

From then on and forevermore. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will accomplish this" (Isaiah 9:6-7).
The angel Gabriel reaffirmed this and told Mary, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have

his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. And the Lord God will give
to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his
there will be no end" (Luke 1:30-33).
On the day of Pentecost, the apostle Peter, as the Spirit gave him utterance, preached the first gospel
about Jesus Christ. He spoke of His miracles, His death, His burial, and His resurrection. He
spoke how Jesus had ascended to the Father and how God exalted Him and placed Jesus at His
hand. He concluded his message in Acts 2:36, "Let all the house of Israel therefore know for
that God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus whom you crucified." You should

Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were

other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth" (Matthew
6:24). What's true for the love of money is also true for the love of any other activity. If you
love sin more than the Lord you can't the blessings of God. First John 2:15-17 says, "Do not
love the nor the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in
him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life,
is not from the Father, but is from the world. The world is away, and also its lusts; but the
one who does the will of God lives forever."
If the Lord Jesus is the one Lord of all, He is your Lord and Master too. Your soul

that you aren't accountable. Even if you don't acknowledge Him as Lord, you'll give an to

notice or that God doesn't care. He sees and He cares.
